Eligibility:

Psychology courses are open to UCEAP reciprocity students studying at UCLA as Pre-Psychology majors only. Certain courses are restricted to UCLA students officially in the Psychology, Psychobiology, or Cognitive Science majors.

Students studying at UCLA under other majors may not enroll in Psychology courses during the first or second enrollment passes.

Course Selection:

The ten-week quarter is short and can be challenging for students who are accustomed to semester terms.

Not every course is offered each quarter or each year. It might not be possible to enroll in your preferred courses. Be prepared to make alternate course selections.

Psychology course at UCLA are in high demand and **enrollment in more than one Psychology course per quarter cannot be guaranteed.**

Psychology (PSYCH) lab courses 101, 111, M116A, 116B, 121, 126, 131, 136A, 136B, M136C, 151, 158, 186A-E are in high demand and enrollment is prioritized for UCLA degree-seeking students who need the course to graduate.

Additionally, Psychology (PSYCH) core courses 110, 115, 120A, 120B, and the PSYCH 124 series are in high demand and will only be open to pre-Psychology majors on second pass, space permitting.

Enrollment:

You will manage your enrollment through [MyUCLA](#).

Check the [Schedule of Classes](#) to verify that the times and days of the classes and final exams do not coincide.

Read the class notes and enrollment restrictions to see which courses are open to Pre-Psychology majors on the first and second enrollment pass. **Note that most Psychology courses do not have enforced prerequisites, so you should be able to enroll in courses, regardless of preparation coursework.**

Do not wait until you arrive at UCLA. Classes will likely be full before the start of the term.

You must enroll in a minimum of 12 course units to remain in good academic standing. To fulfill this requirement, you will need to choose the remainder of your courses (one or two more) from other departments (e.g., history, English, area or ethnic studies courses, etc.).
